


God, the Creator, in the person of the Son breathed a first and a last breath as a man to make all who believe in him - in his finished work - free from sin and death.


God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not 🔉


sten, O coastlands, to me, and take heed, you peoples from afar! The IORD has called me from the womb; from the matrix of my mother he has made mention of my

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon him, and by his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way; and the IORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; he was led as a lamb to the slaughter,









and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgement, and who will declare his generation? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgressions of my people he was stricken. And they made his grave with the wicked-but with the rich at his death, because he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth. Yet it pleased the IORD to bruise him; he has put *him* to grief. When you make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see *his* seed, he shall prolong *his* days, and the pleasure of the IORD shall prosper in his hand.

He shall see the labour of his soul, and be satisfied. By his knowledge my righteous Servant shall justify many, for he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore I will divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul unto death, and he was numbered with the transgressors, and he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.







Therefore, in all things he had to be made like his brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation [appease the wrath of God] for the sins of the people. For in that he himself has suffered, being tempted [yet without committing any sin], he is able to aid those who are tempted [us, people].










ow there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the








it was, as the multitude pressed about him to hear the word of God, that he stood by the Jake of Gennesaret, and saw two www.www.boats standing by the lake; but

But Simon answered and said to him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Jord!" And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed him.













nd when he stepped out on the land, there met him a certain man from the city who had demons for a long time. And he wore no clothes, nor did he live in a house but in the

tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out, fell down before him, and with a loud voice said, "What have I to do with you, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me!" For it had often seized him, and he was kept under guard, bound with chains and shackles; and he broke the bonds and was driven by the demon into the wilderness. Jesus asked him, saying, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," because many demons had entered him. And they begged him that he would not command them to go out into the abyss. Now a herd of many swine was feeding there on the mountain. So they begged him that he would permit them to enter them. And he permitted them. Then the demons went out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd ran violently down the steep place into the lake and drowned.



When those who fed *them* saw what had happened, they fled and told *it* in the city and in the country. Then they went out to see what had happened, and came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. They also who had seen *it* told them by what means he who had been demon-possessed was healed. Then the whole multitude of the surrounding region of the Gadarenes asked him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. And he got into the boat and returned.

How the man from whom the demons had departed begged him that he might be with him. But Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your own house, and tell what great things God has done for you." And he went his way and proclaimed throughout the whole city what great things Jesus had done for him.

Soming out, he [Jesus] went to the Mount of Olives, as he was accustomed, and his disciples also followed him. When he came to the place, he said to

them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." And he was withdrawn from them about a stone's throw, and he knelt down and prayed, saying, "Father, if it is your will, take this cup away from me; nevertheless not my will, but yours, be done."

And being in agony, he prayed more earnestly. Then his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. body of Jesus. Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a tomb that was hewn out of the rock, where no one had ever lain before. And the women who had come with him from Galilee followed after, and they observed the tomb and how his body was laid.

ow on the first day of the week, very early in Hthe morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. Then they went in and did not find the body of the Jord Jesus. And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen!



Remember how he spoke to you when he was still in Galilee, saying, 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again." And they remembered his words. And he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do doubts arise in your hearts? Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Handle me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see I have." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet.

Then he said to them, "These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Iaw of Moses and *the* Prophets and *the* Psalms concerning me. Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. And you are witnesses of these things."

the Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. And he found in the temple those messessesses who sold oxen and sheep

and doves, and the moneychangers doing business. And he said to those who sold doves, "Jake these things away! Do not make my Father's house a house of merchandise!" Then his disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house has eaten me up."

o the Jews answered and said to him, "What Isign do you show to us, since you do these things?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." Then the Jews said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking of the temple of his body. Therefore, when he had risen from the dead [3 days after his crucifixion], his disciples remembered that he had said this to them; and they believed the Scripture and the word which Jesus had said. John, chapter 2





hen Jesus said to them again, "I am going away, and you will seek me, and will die in your sin. Where I go you cannot come." And he said to them,


"You are from beneath; Π am from above. You are of this world; Π am not of this world. Therefore Π said to you that you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that Π am *he*, you will die in your sins." Then Jesus said to them, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will know that Π am *he*, and *that* Π do nothing of myself; but as my Father taught me, Π speak these things. And he who sent me is with me. The Father has not left me alone, for Π always do those things that please him."

As he spoke these words, many believed in Ahim. Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are my disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM."













hen they led Jesus from Caiaphas [the High Priest] to the Praetorium, and it was early morning. But they themselves did not go into the

Praetorium [a Gentile courtyard], lest they should be defiled, but that they might eat the Passover. Pilate then went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this man?" They answered and said to him, "If he were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered him up to you." Then Pilate said to them, "You take him and judge him according to your law." Therefore the Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death," that the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled which he spoke, signifying by what death he would die. Then Pilate entered the Praetorium again, called Jesus, and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but Mow my kingdom is not from here."





Pilate therefore said to him, "Are you a king then?" Jesus answered, "You say *rightly* that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?" And when he had said this, he went out again to the Jews, and said to them, "I find no fault in him at all.

Then they all cried again, saying, "Not this man, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a robber. So then Pilate took Jesus and scourged him. And the soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put *it* on his head, and they put on him a purple robe. Then they said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck him with their hands. Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And *Pilate* said to them, "Behold the man!" Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "You take him and crucify him, for





The Jews answered him, "We have a law, Land according to our law he ought to die, because he made himself the Son of God." Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, and went again into the Praetorium, and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" Then Pilate said to him, "Are you not speaking to me? Do you not know that I have power to crucify you, and power to release you?" Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered me to you has the greater sin." From then on Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out, saying, "If you let this man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar." When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgement seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour [noon].







And he said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" But they cried out, "Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!" Then he delivered him to them to be crucified. And he, bearing his cross, went out to a place called *the Place* of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha, where they crucified him, and two others with him, one on either side, and Jesus in the centre.

How Pilate wrote a title and put *it* on the cross. And the writing was: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. Then many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Greek, *and* Jatin. Therefore the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but, 'He said, "I am the King of the Jews."" Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written."

John, chapters 18 & 19










on the first *day* of the week [Sunday] Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and **maxes and been** saw *that* the stone had been

taken away from the tomb [where Jesus' body had been laid]. Peter therefore went out, and the other disciple [John], and were going to the tomb. And he, stooping down and looking in, saw the linen cloths lying there; yet he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; and he saw the linen cloths lying there, and the handkerchief that had been around his head, not lying with the linen cloths, but folded together in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also; and he saw and believed. For as yet they did not know the Scripture, that he must rise again from the dead. Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be

with you."



When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Jord. So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent me, I also send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. And after eight days his disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace to you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Reach your finger here, and look at my hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into my side. Do not be unbelieving, but believing." And Thomas answered and said to him, "My Jord and my God!" And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name. 🛪 John, chapter 20

Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Jord and Christ."



aul, a bondservant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated to the gospel of God which he promised before through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures,

concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who was born of the seed of David according to the flesh, *and* declared *to be* the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead. To all who are in Rome, beloved of God, called *to be* saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. Much more then, having now been justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? I thank Godthrough Jesus Christ our Jord! So then, with the mind I

myself serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin. For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: he condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not his. And if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit *is* life because of righteousness.

nd I, brethren, when I came to you,



did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. And my speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of human wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God. However, we speak wisdom among those who are mature, yet not the wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God ordained before the ages for our glory, which none of the rulers of this age knew; for had they known, they would not have crucified the Jord of glory. But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love him."

🖌 I Corinthians, chapter 2







I the Apostle Paul received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on manage the same night in which he

was betrayed took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "Jake, eat; this is my body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same manner he also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Jord's death till he comes. Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgement to himself, not discerning the Jord's body. For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. a Corinthians, chaptern



I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that he

was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he was seen by Cephas [Peter], then by the twelve. After that he was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep [died]. After that he was seen by James, then by all the apostles. Then last of all he was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time. Now if Christ is preached that he has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty. Yes, and we are found false witnesses of God, because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ, whom he did not raise up-if in fact the dead do not rise.

For if *the* dead do not rise, then Christ is not risen. And if Christ is not risen, your faith *is* futile; you are still in your sins! But now Christ is risen from the dead, *and* has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

For since by man [Adam] came death, by man [Christ] also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. But each one in his own order: Christ the first-fruits, afterward those who are Christ's at his coming.

Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father, when he puts an end to all rule and all authority and power. For he must reign till he has put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy *that* will be destroyed *is* death. The sting of death *is* sin, and the strength of sin *is* the law. But thanks *be* to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

I Corinthians, chapter 15







we who are in this tent [our human body] groan, being burdened, not because we want to be 🔉

clothed, that mortality may be swallowed up by life. So we are always confident, knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Jord. We are confident, yes, well pleased rather to be absent from the body and to be present with the Lord. Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to him. For we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad. For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; or if we are of sound mind, it is for you. For the love of Christ compels us, because we judge thus: that if one [Jesus Christ] died for all, then all died; and he died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died for them and rose again.







Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. Now all things *are* of God, who has reconciled us to himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. For he made him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

Iknow a man in Christ [Paul] who fourteen years ago-whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows-such a one was caught up to the third heaven. And I know such a man-how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth.

II Corinthians, chapters 5 & 12







ho has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed among you as crucified?

Galatians, chapter 3

Having begun in the Spirit, are you now being made perfect by the flesh? For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who does not continue in all things which are written in the book of the law, to do them." But that no one is justified by the law in the sight of God is evident, for "the just shall live by faith." Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"), that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. Now to Abraham and his Seed were the promises made. He does not say, "And to seeds," as of many, but as of one, "And to your Seed," who is Christ.







Iessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as he chose us in him

before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of the glory of his grace, by which he has made us accepted in the Beloved.

In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace which he made to abound toward us in all wisdom and prudence, having made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure which he purposed in himself, that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times he might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth—in him.

o the saints and faithful brethren in Christ who are in Colosse: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. He has delivered

ut I do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning those who have fallen asleep [died], lest you sorrow as others who have no hope. For if [since] we believe that Jesus died and

rose again, even so God will bring with him those who sleep in Jesus. Then we who are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Jord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Jord.



yourselves you know perfectly that the day of the Jord so comes as a thief in the night. For when they say, "Peace and safety!"

then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labour pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape. But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Jord Jesus Christ, who died for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with him.

o not quench the Spirit. Do not despise Prophecies. Jest all things; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil. Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Jord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it.

ut Christ came *as* High Priest of the good things to come, with the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made with hands, that is, not of this creation. Not with the blood of goats

and calves, but with his own blood he entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh [the Jewish sacrificial system], how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

And for this reason he is the Mediator of the new covenant, by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions under the first covenant, that those who are called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance. For where there *is* a testament, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator.





nd according to the Mosaic law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission [of sin]. Therefore it was necessary that the copies of the things in the heavens should be purified with these, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us; not that he should offer himself often, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood of another-he then would have had to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now, once at the end of the ages, he has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgement, so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for him he will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation.

Hebrews, chapter 9







it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins. Therefore, when he came into the world, he said:

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you have prepared for me. In burnt offerings and *sacrifices* for sin you had no pleasure. Then I said, 'Behold, I have comein the volume of the book it is written of me-to do your will, O God.""

By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God, from that time waiting till his enemies are made his footstool. For by one offering he has perfected forever those who are being sanctified.

Hebrews, chapter 10









esus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried about with various and strange doctrines. We have an altar from which those who serve the

tabernacle have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are burned outside the camp. Therefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered outside the gate. Therefore let us go forth to him, outside the camp, bearing his reproach. Now may the God of peace who brought up our Jord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you complete in every good work to do his will, working in you what is well pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever.

Hebrews, chapter 13








Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in **make alive by**
